

North Craven Heritage Trust AGM Treasurer's Report

Year Ending 31 August 2024

Receipts

The underlying level of subscriptions and donations declined slightly this year (£3,431/*£3,741*), but we received in addition a restricted donation of £1,000 for David Johnson's Gauber archaeology dig.

The final legacy payment from the estate of the late Joan Crompton (£4,197) was received this year. Thanks to the interest on investments made with that legacy, bank and building society interest increased substantially (£1,878/£36).

Payments

Administration costs declined by £2,999. This was primarily due to the lack of a paid Secretary this year following Anne Webster's ill-health retirement. She is greatly missed. Her work has been shared out to a degree between the Trustees. To reduce the burden we are asking members to accept the use of email wherever possible. Website costs have also declined (£27/£576) as the new website set up in 2022/23 required only maintenance this year.

Grants

We made a donation of $\pm 2,000$ to the Gauber dig, of which $\pm 1,000$ was funded by the restricted donation noted above.

Balances

Our closing balance increased substantially (£59,788/£54,546) thanks to the final legacy payment and reduced administration costs.

Outlook for 2024-25

We have continued to pursue other university history departments in addition to Lancaster with the aim of deepening our understanding of North Craven's past, although without any bursary applicants so far.

We are producing a leaflet to publicise all the grants we offer, which we hope to circulate widely, including to all townships across North Craven.

Independent Examiner of the Accounts

The accounts which follow have been examined by Ian Evans, a retired HM Inspector of Taxes. He has done this for the past two years for which we are very grateful. I hope that you will support Ian's re-appointment and express your thanks.

Note 1

The General Fund balances are held in a NatWest Current account and in a Skipton Building Society account. Legacy Fund balances are held in NatWest 35-day and 95-day accounts; and in Charity Bank fixed term deposits. As the decision to segregate the funds in this way was taken during the year, the opening balances have been re-cast to reflect the change. Actual opening and closing balances are shown in Note 8 below. Note 2

Gift aid is claimed a year in arrears. The amounts shows refer to gift aid on subscriptions for the preceding year. Note 3

The final payment from the estate of the late Joan Compton (£4,197) was received during the year.

Note 4

Interest from the Skipton Building Society account is credited to the General Fund. Interest from the NatWest notice accounts and from the Charity Bank term accounts is credited to the Legacy Fund.

Note 5

The drop in administration costs (2023/4: £2192 - 2022/3: £5191) reflects our lack of a paid Secretary this year.

Website expenditure is included within administration (£27)

Note 6

Printing costs for the Giggleswick book have been charged to the Legacy Fund since the book represents a long-term investment. Note 7

A grant of £2,000 was made for the Gauber archaeology project. £1,000 of this was funded by a restricted donation.
