Dear Sir

I received on Saturday your letter  
and should the deed I will set executed by  
Mr James Turner as soon as he returns from  
South Durham where he at present is

We will desire Mr Stewart to look at the small  
estate of which you have been kind enough to send  
the advertisement. at the same time let me think  
we shall be inclined to extend our property in  
that quarter. to whom does the Tarn belong -

I have since seen your extract from the Dawn day  
to parish Magazine. you must write to Mr  
Watson for his sketch of the river as I shall  
not see him again

I have this morning received the enclosed from  
Mr Pearson Clerk. it would seem as if the  
application had been made under the 1<sup>st</sup> Act of 1832  
but I very much doubt whether the farmer required by that

statute have been complied with. viz that the  
application to the commissioners was signed at a  
parochial meeting duly called by two thirds of the in  
value of the land owners in Tent. under the statute  
the Commissioners has no power to set out a  
new boundary but he is to set out the old boundary  
I should wish you to ascertain if you can have the fact  
viz if they have done all properly under the statute  
which I apprehend is open to a township to do  
then no comment of the Lord of the exchequer; Maria  
is necessary.

If upon enquiry you find that you can set up  
the case in time to your own satisfaction we have  
no objection to proceeding but I would not make  
any conception or vain conjecture at all events  
until you see what cause the Commissioners may be  
likely to pursue - we should also be very much  
satisfied by your opinion as to whether we should  
empty ourselves or not, certainly not unless we could  
fix upon some individuals upon whom we  
could rely with entire confidence I will see
