Sir this is to inform you that I
 have reserved a letter ^{from} a friend at
 Lancaster to meet him at Yorkston
 on the 20 of the instant June and I
 went a coach daily and met him
 and he told me that you ordered
 him to ^{send} for me which was very
 much a blyde to you for it so he
 said he was comed to between the
 River Doyle and I was to point have
 out the boundary so we went on to
 Yorkston fell hill and started there
 and went in the water. Decided
 between Blessmore and Little Dale
 up to the crage place in the
 morning we proceeded forward to
 the Little Dale head at the water
 Decided we took to the Little wood
 at the water which up to the 3
 turns used where we got there
 we had a deal to do

that man had water please to
go by and has please take in two of
the barrels but will care get more
the water raised all into Tent so
we persuaded me to when in field
so when we got to the far end we had
succeeded so he said Mr. Huxley ordered
him to pay me so I charged 5 shillings
a day and he payed me so I begged me
never to not go by the marks
that was set out & he said he thought
he could find the marks a guinea so
I wish you to weight to have to go no
farther than the marks so when you
can get me a rather job I shall
be very much obliged to you for
it so I must leave at present
I am truly your most humble
servant
