## North Craven Heritage Trust – Cultural or Environmental Grant Application Criteria

- 1. Applications for grants can be made by the trustees, managers or organisers of any cultural event or environmental development which is specifically relevant to North Craven and will take place within North Craven. North Craven covers the civil parishes of Airton, Arncliffe, Austwick, Bentham, Burton-in-Lonsdale, Clapham cum Newby, Giggleswick, Halton Gill, Halton West, Hanlith, Hawkswick, Hellifield, Horton-in-Ribblesdale, Ingleton, Kirkby Malham, Langcliffe, Lawkland, Litton, Long Preston, Malham, Malham Moor, Nappa, Otterburn, Rathmell, Scosthrop, Settle, Stainforth, Swinden, Thornton-in-Lonsdale and Wigglesworth. Supported events or developments must be open to the public on a regular basis.
- 2. Grants will be made where it is difficult to obtain other funding. The Trust expects the trustees, managers or organisers to apply to other grant making trusts and organisations. A full report on the organisation's financial position must be supplied with the application, detailing how the necessary funds will be raised in order to ensure the project can be completed.
- 3. Applications in the first instance should be by email or in writing to the Treasurer of the NCHT (see "About Us / Contact" for the address of the current Treasurer). The application should outline the proposal that requires grant aid with costings. The applicant need not be a resident of North Craven.
- 4. Applications may be submitted at any time of the year and will be acknowledged on receipt and a likely timescale for a decision communicated to the applicant.
- 5. Grants will not normally be made retrospectively.
